


What is a Lift Station

- Facilities designed to move waste water.
- Lower elevations to higher elevations
- Key elements: wet-well, pumps and piping, motors, power supply system, equipment control and alarm system, and an odor control and ventilation system

Fats Oil and Grease (FOG) in Lift Stations

- Clog and slow functioning of lift station
- Decreases capacity
- Damage to pump and motor
- Weigh down floats
- Throws off level transmitters
- Slow down aerobic activity



FOG in Sanitary Sewer System

- Sanitary Sewer overflows
- Contaminating waterways with disease causing pathogens
- Harmful algal blooms, floating debris and impacts threatened and endangered species
- Property damage
