The plant has been cultivated in Central North America since pre-Columbian times. The flower was used for yellow dye and the seeds provided a black or dull blue dye used in Native American basketry and weaving. The seeds were also ground for flour and used for oil for cooking and dressing hair.

Common Name: Purple Coneflower

Blooming Time: April through September

Wildflower Facts:

It is a popular perennial with smooth stems and longlasting, lavender flowers. Rough, scattered leaves that become small toward the top of the stem.

Flowers occur singly atop the stems and have domed, purplish-brown, spiny centers and drooping, lavender rays.



Common Name: Blue Mistflower
