A Capital Improvements Plan Advisory Committee (CIPAC) meeting was held on Wednesday, June 21, 2023, at the Carrollton City Hall in the Council Briefing Room.

- 1. The meeting of the Capital Improvements Plan Advisory Committee (CIPAC) was called to order by Chairperson Karim Ali at 6:31 PM.
- 2. Ali opened the motion for approval of previous meeting's minutes, and the motion was approved unanimously.
- 3. Updates On Bond Sale Diana Vaughn, CFO, provided updates on the bond sale. She provided a breakdown of the sale, which included \$29.4 million of bonds sold, \$2.8 million in 2013 bonds redeemed, and had a total cost of issuance of \$300 thousand. Ali asked for the amount the amount of bonds refunded, which Vaughn responded with \$5.6 million. Vaughn also stated that revenue bonds, funded by water rates, will be issued in FY24.
- 4. Update On Current CIP Projects At 6:51 PM, Jonathan Wheat, Director of Engineering, began the discussion on CIP project updates. He then turned the presentation over to Senior Engineer, Emily Busby. Busby stated that the City had five projects going into construction soon and 20 currently in the design phase. Additionally, she stated that no major projects had been completed since the March 22, 2023 CIPAC meeting. Busby also stated that the water tower project is nearly completed. Abousaid asked

Busby for an update on construction prices. Busby explained that prices have remained relatively stable and that she does not expect them to decrease in the upcoming years. Busby stated that the Engineering team recently hired on an experienced engineer to assist with increased workload. Wheat explained that the Engineering Department has been cross training engineering staff in order to keep projects on track and reduce workload among the engineering divisions. Wheat explained that projects are never delayed unless something is identified during the design phase which prevents the project from progressing. Wheat stated that 13 projects are currently pending, which Ali requested additional information on.

- 5. Discuss FY24 CIPAC Recommendations Wheat began with an overview of the FY23 CIPAC recommendations. Ali stated that sidewalks were chosen as priority in FY23 due to increased usage by all ages. Ali opened the discussion to the Committee for input. Hughey stated that she would like to see an emphasis on street light projects followed by alley related projects. Wheat explained that alley conditions are the most common feedback the City receives from residents. He also provided some of the amounts provided to the recommendations in the FY23 budget. The committee discussed the recommendations and Ali opened the meeting for a vote. The committee completed the vote and the recommendations were as follows:
  - 1. Residential Street Lights
  - 2. Alleys
  - 3. Sidewalks
  - 4. Intersection Improvements
- 6. Schedule and Discussion of Future Meeting The committee decided on September 20, 2023, for the next CIPAC Meeting.
- 7. Other Business Ali requested a breakdown of the 2013/2018 bond packages, and a breakdown of the most recent bond sale by fund.
- 8. The CIPAC Meeting was adjourned by Chairperson Ali at 7:41 PM




